Dear Farmingdale family,

Greetings! I hope you and your loved ones are doing well. The Special Task Force has been preparing the building for our return to worship on Sunday, 10/4. We are re-gathering in our sanctuary for the first time since March 8 to celebrate World Communion Sunday.

FPC guidelines are taken from the 7/21/2020 Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) recommendations, the Center for Disease Control, and Presbyterian Church (USA) guidelines. These practices are in place so that we can be together again in a way that reduces the spread of COVID-19 and were developed with the consideration for certain groups – those over 65, those who have serious underlying medical conditions, and those with small children. Please help us to protect one another so that we can meet face-to-face safely.

### Here are the practices we are implementing:

- 1. **Face coverings** must be worn at all times upon entering the church for worship.
- 2. **Seating and standing areas** will be marked to maintain physical distancing of 6 feet or more between congregants from different households.
- 3. **Service length** will be shortened to a **maximum of 40 minutes** with **no group singing or recitation** as these activities contribute to the spread of COVID-19.
- 4. **A maximum of 50 people** will be allowed to attend indoor worship.
- 5. **Temperatures will be taken** for each person when entering the church.
- 6. **Hand sanitizer** will be placed in multiple locations to be used when entering the building and after use of the restrooms.
- 7. **Entering and exiting the building** will be guided by ushers maintaining social distances at all times.
- 8. A secure donation box will be used instead of passing the offering plates.
- 9. One person at a time will be allowed to use the restroom. Cleaning supplies and instructions will be placed at the restrooms to be used when leaving.
- 10. Increased cleaning and disinfecting procedures will be utilized after indoor services.
- 11. **Attendance** will be recorded in case contact tracing is needed.

# So what will it be like when you get to church?

Upon leaving your car, please put on your mask, stay with your family, and maintain six foot distance between each group. Even though the heat will be on, the windows and doors will be open to increase the fresh air in our gathering space. **Make sure you bring a jacket or covering as you might get chilly.** 

As you are waiting to enter the building, the lines on the sidewalk are markers to help you maintain distance.

Please use the new touchless hand sanitizing machine in the entry.

An usher will take your temperature.

Please self-monitor by answering the questions we are all too familiar with:

• Have you experienced a cough, loss of taste, or fever?

- Have you been tested for COVID-19?
- Have you been exposed to anyone who is being tested or is positive for COVID-19?

If you can answer yes, we ask you to return home to protect yourself & others.

Before entering the sanctuary, pick up from the table your worship supplies such as worship bulletins (1 per family), communion elements in individual snack bags (on communion Sundays), and any other handouts or supplies.

At this table, an usher will sign you in. We are maintaining attendance records for contact tracing if needed.

When entering the sanctuary, be mindful of maintaining your distance.

Pews that are <u>off limits</u> are marked by pool noodles & ribbons. Please sit in the area where there is wood showing on the back of the pew. The sliding doors to the Fellowship Hall will be open to increase seating for family groups around the tables and give you plenty of room to maneuver around other households.

Once you are seated, please remain in your seat until the end of the service which should be 40 minutes or less. If you must use the restroom, please mind your distance and only one person at a time in the restroom.

After the service, please mind your distance and exit when dismissed.

Some other things to remember:

- We <u>WILL</u> be celebrating communion this Sunday. You will receive communion elements as you enter. Pastor Lonna will give you further instructions when we get to that part of the service.
- When we resume with liturgists, each speaker will use a separate microphone.
- There will be no Sunday School classes because of space limitations.

We will continue to broadcast services on Facebook Live. We are aware of and working on the connection issues. As we move into the building, we are hoping the wireless connection will be stronger. Please let us know if there are still problems We may need to purchase new recording equipment that has the ability to save the service as a recording and/or be hard wired into the DSL line.

We are looking forward to being together again after almost 7 months out of our sanctuary. Everything will feel different even though our surroundings will be familiar. Please be patient with us as we move into the building and remember the 3 "W"s – wear your mask, wash your hands, and watch your distance.

Parable of the tenant farmers <sup>33</sup> "Listen to another parable. There was a landowner who planted a vineyard. He put a fence around it, dug a winepress in it, and built a tower. Then he rented it to tenant farmers and took a trip. 34 When it was time for harvest, he sent his servants to the tenant farmers to collect his fruit. 35 But the tenant farmers grabbed his

servants. They beat some of them, and some of them they killed. Some of them they stoned to death. <sup>36</sup> "Again he sent other servants, more than the first group. They treated them in the same way. <sup>37</sup> Finally he sent his son to them. 'They will respect my son,' he said.

38 "But when the tenant farmers saw the son, they said to each other, 'This is the heir. Come on, let's kill him and we'll have his inheritance.' 39 They grabbed him, threw him out of the vineyard, and killed him.

<sup>40</sup> "When the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenant farmers?"

<sup>41</sup> They said, "He will totally destroy those wicked farmers and rent the vineyard to other tenant farmers who will give him the fruit when it's ready."

<sup>42</sup> Jesus said to them, "Haven't you ever read in the scriptures, The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone. The Lord has done this, and it's amazing in our eyes?[a] 43 Therefore, I tell you that God's kingdom will be taken away from you and will be given to a people who produce its fruit. 44 Whoever falls on this stone will be crushed. And the stone will crush the person it falls on."

<sup>45</sup> Now when the chief priests and the Pharisees heard the parable, they knew Jesus was talking about them. 46 They were trying to arrest him, but they feared the crowds, who thought he was a prophet.
